Contributions to Hartley College Students and their achievements in sports and academics.

You all are aware that HCP-PA Canada/USA has committed to fund Rs.250,000 per

year for sporting activities at least until 2013. We have almost secured enough funds fulfill this obligation.

Our student A.C. John Niraj, who became second in national level in the G.C.E. (A/L) examination in August 2009, has faced the Olympiad Physics Competition and selected to the level Asian competition. Eight students were selected island wide and he is the only one selected from the Tamil medium schools. The Asian level competition was held in Taiwan on April 23 2010.

HCPPA Canada/USA sponsored his travel expenses of Rs. 62,000.

We also awarded Rs 15,000 to Hariharan Vadivesvarasan for his excellence in the national sports meet.

Mas. Thurailingam Balakumar got the first place in the under 19 pole vault in the northern province and cleared the height of 3.41m and broke the previous provincial record of 3.40m height in 2009 and was also awarded with the gold medal for this event.

Mas. Vadives varan got first place in the under 21 discus throw and cleared the distance of 37.29m and broke the previous record.

Mas. Vadives varan Harikaran secured the first place for discus throw in the "Sir John Tarbat senior championship conducted by Sri Lanka schools Athletic Association and cleared the distance of 40.95m and was awarded with gold medal and colours award.

In addition to this, our under 13 boys secured first place in 4 x 100 meters relay and our under 175boys secured second place in 4 x 100 meters relay in the provincial athletic meet competition.

Funding Commitments of HCPPA Canada/USA

HCPPA Canada & USA, along with the other PPA branches around the world support the decision of Hartley PPA Global Trust to purchase the 5.6 larcham land opposite to the school.

HCPPA Canada/USA agreed to raise and contribute \$6,000 towards this project. Hartley Trust under the stewardship of Mr. Shanmuganthan is purchasing this land with a view of building a vocational training centre with funding from the government or NGOs. This centre will serve everyone in the greater Point Pedro/Vadamarachi region. With this project Hartley will expand its services to the entire region.

Year 2010 has brought some relief to our students as Hartley college is no longer in the high security zone (HSZ). The military has withdrawn from the vicinity of our college. Our Principal and our Global Trust Chairman are now in a position to approach various NGO's for funding of buildings if a land is available or a facility that was destroyed during the conflict. To this end, they have been working very hard. On the educational front, we have seen lots of improvement. Our GCE A/L and O/L results for year 2009 is far better than last year or many previous years; but the performance is far below compared to the pre-conflict years.

It is understandable that the students would need time to catch up with the rest of the island after going through a horrendous time throughout their entire educational time.

The level playing fields also have changed with the explosion of technology. We at Hartley College have to go leaps and bounds to have the technological resources that are available in the south. It is the **expatriate Hartley community that can bring** Hartley College back to its glory.

TREASURER'S NOTE

We had a fairly good year in terms of fund flow and membership. Our membership increased by twelve to two hundred and eighteen. We made a net profit of \$1800 form AGM dinner and \$1000 from the benefit show.

Attendance to the benefit show was rather disappointing. Even our own committee members did not show up though they all sold and paid for tickets. This is a clear indication that the members as well as those who normally support us are not interested in coming to the benefit shows any more. We need to think a new strategy to raise

funds in the coming years.

This year seven members contributed a total of \$1950 towards 'Present College Needs Spots Fund' (PCNSF) and we transferred \$2,133 (SLR 250,000) to PPA being our contribution for year 2010 to be given to the Principal. This brings our current balance in PCNSF account to \$1,900.

We paid for the cost of the air ticket SLR 62,000 to Mas. A.C.John Niraj, who was flying to Taiwan to participate Asian level Olympiad Physics Competition at the principal's request. Also, we awarded SLR 15,000 to Master Vadivesvaran appreciating his gold medal winning in the all island competition. Two of our

members contributed \$225 towards the cost of the air ticket.

Additional contributions were received for Atput-Nava fund and Karunanidy Memorial fund \$520 and \$350 respectively. A new fund was opened in memory of our late principal MR. C. P. Thamothiram with a contribution of \$2000 from Mr. N. Perinbnayagam. Total fund inflow for the year was \$7,350. During the year, we transferred \$5,000.00 into GIC account with TD Bank which brings our total GIC with TD to \$25,427.

NAME

Constitutional amendment and election of Vice Patrons

During the 2009 AGM, HCPPA Canada/USA constitution was amended as follows:

7. PATRON AND VICE PATRONS

- 1. The principal of Hartley College shall be the Patron of the association. Association may have up to a maximum of five Vice Patrons, principally to honour those who have rendered great service to the association in the past.
- 2. Vice Patrons will be recommended by the executive committee and shall be duly appointed on receiving confirmation at an AGM by a two third majority of the members attending the AGM.
- 3. To be recommended, one should have been a member for a minimum of ten years, had actively participated in the activities of the association including being the member of the executive committee for a minimum of five years and should be over 65 years of age. Nominees shall give written consent to serve and to go through the confirmation process at the AGM.
- 4. Vice Patrons shall serve the association in an advisory capacity, and render assistance when requested by the executive committee.
- 5.Vice Patrons shall not be eligible to be elected as a member of executive committee of the association.
- Mr. V. Eeswaranathan, Mr. K. Rajaratnam and Mr. M. Atputhanathan have been unanimously elected as Vice-Patrons.
